15th May

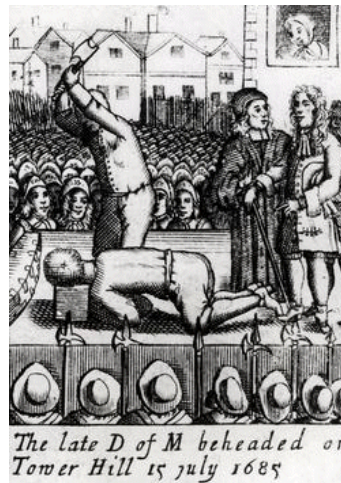
Norman Castles in Devon
